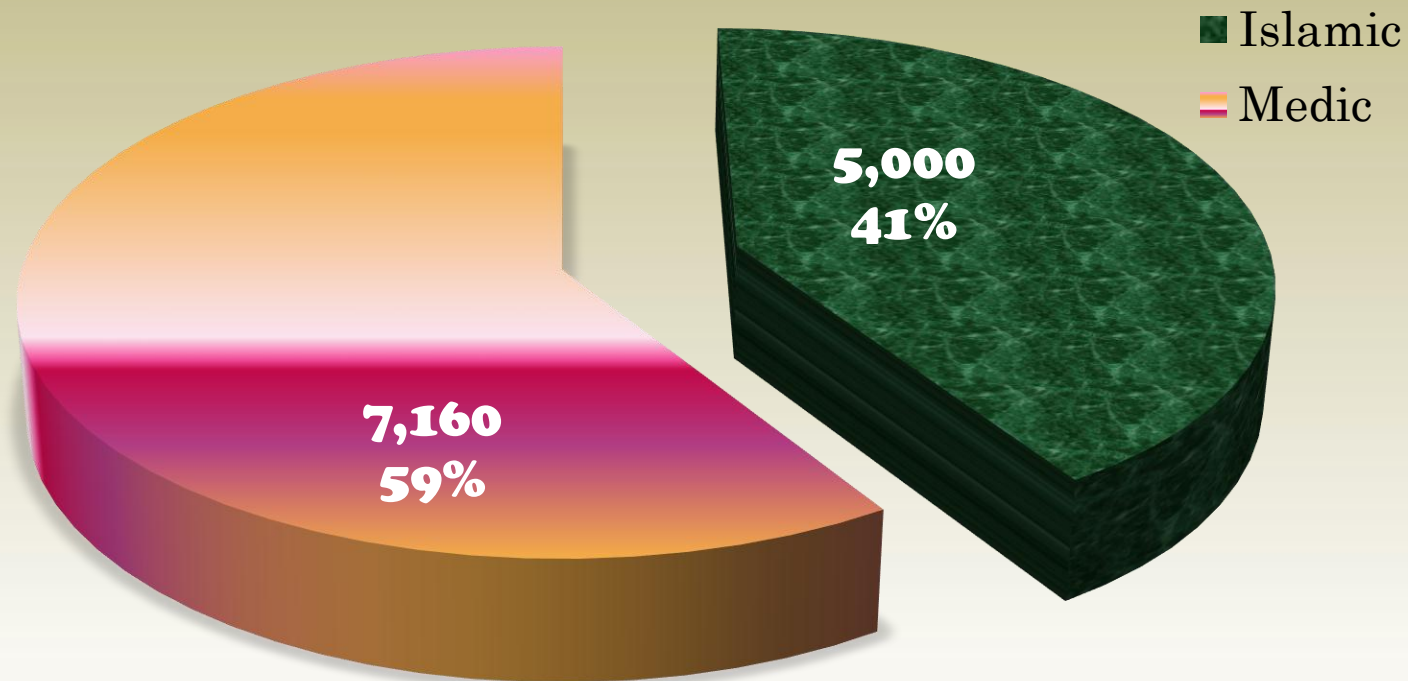

# Why Study in Malaysia?

- The quality of education in Malaysia conforms to international standards and is monitored by the Ministry of Higher Education Malaysia through quality control authorities and legislations such as The Education Act 1996, The Private Higher Education Institutions Act 1996 and the Malaysian Qualifications Agency Act 2007.
- Education in Malaysia offers competitive course fees, extensive selection of popular courses, an innovative range of study options and numerous universities and colleges to choose from.
- Twinning degree programmes conducted in Malaysia, offer cost-effective routes to foreign qualifications from universities in the UK, the USA, Australia, Canada, New Zealand and France.
- Foreign University Branch Campuses from the UK and Australia allow students to acquire a qualification more cost-effectively.
- The usage of English as a medium of instruction and communication makes living and studying convenient for students; and creates a conducive environment for those aspiring to learn English.
- The multi-cultural society in Malaysia provides opportunities for local and international students from different ethnic backgrounds to mingle and forge the spirit of fellowship.
- Malaysia is already home to over 70,000 students from 150 countries a testimony that it is a centre of quality higher education.

The following provisions make studying in Malaysia even more attractive:-

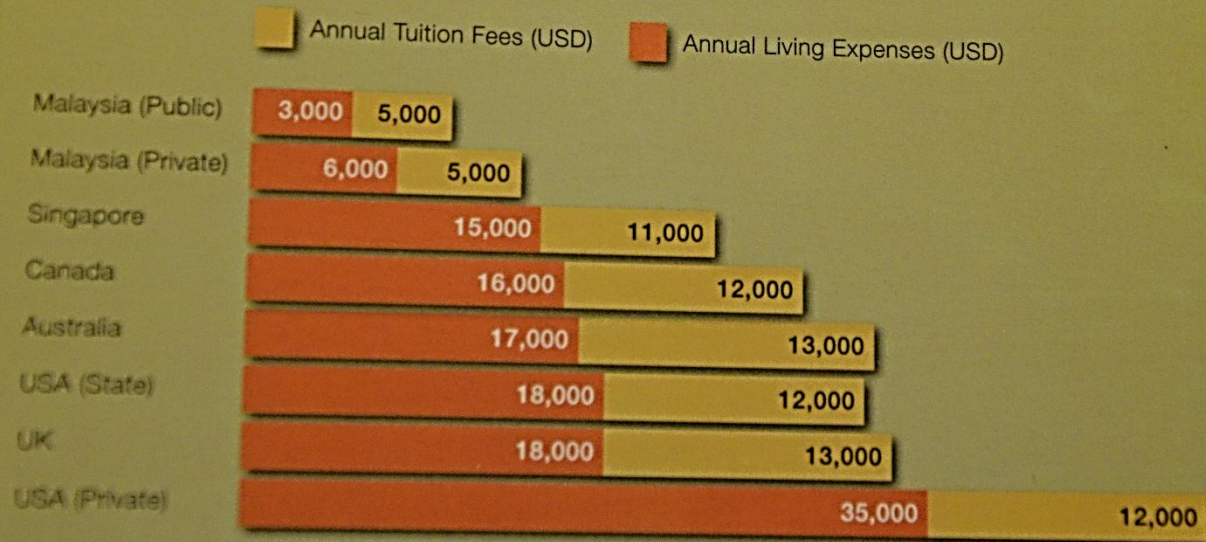
- Simple immigration procedures.

- Extensive network of banks, post offices, shopping centres, restaurants and entertainment outlets.



# AFFORDABLE EDUCATION

An international student can expect to have annual living expenses of around USD 5,000 depending on their lifestyle. Tuition fee is also much lower than any other developed country in the world. Below is a comparison of study costs for an engineering degree programme.

## Cost Comparison

The relatively low cost of education in Malaysia coupled with the availability of internationally-recognised qualifications highlight another significant factor why international students choose to study here. The following tables show the cost benefits of studying in Malaysia.

## Working Part-time while Studying in Malaysia

International students are also allowed to work part-time (maximum of 20 hours per week during semester breaks or holidays of more than 7 days) while studying full-time in Malaysia, subject to immigration requirements.

# 6 Easy Steps to Study in Malaysia

- 1 The student submits an application form of study together with the relevant documents to the intended educational institution which has an official approval from the Ministry of Home Affairs to recruit international students.
- 2 Once the student's application is accepted by the educational institution, the institution will then help to apply for a student pass from the Malaysian Immigration Department in Malaysia. A favourable health examination report done in the student's home country must be provided during the application of student pass.
- 3 Upon acceptance, a letter of approval for student pass is released by the Malaysian Immigration Department to the educational institution, which will then be passed on to the student.
- 4 Before leaving his/her country for Malaysia, the student informs the educational institution of his/her port of entry (airport), flight number, arrival date and time.
- 5 Upon arrival at the airport in Malaysia, the educational institution's representative receives the student at the immigration check point.
- 6 Within 2 weeks of the student's arrival, the educational institution submits the student's passport to the Immigration Department for the student pass sticker.
